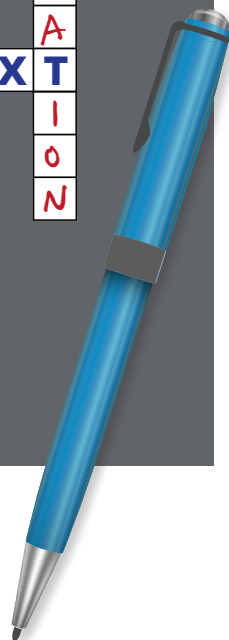
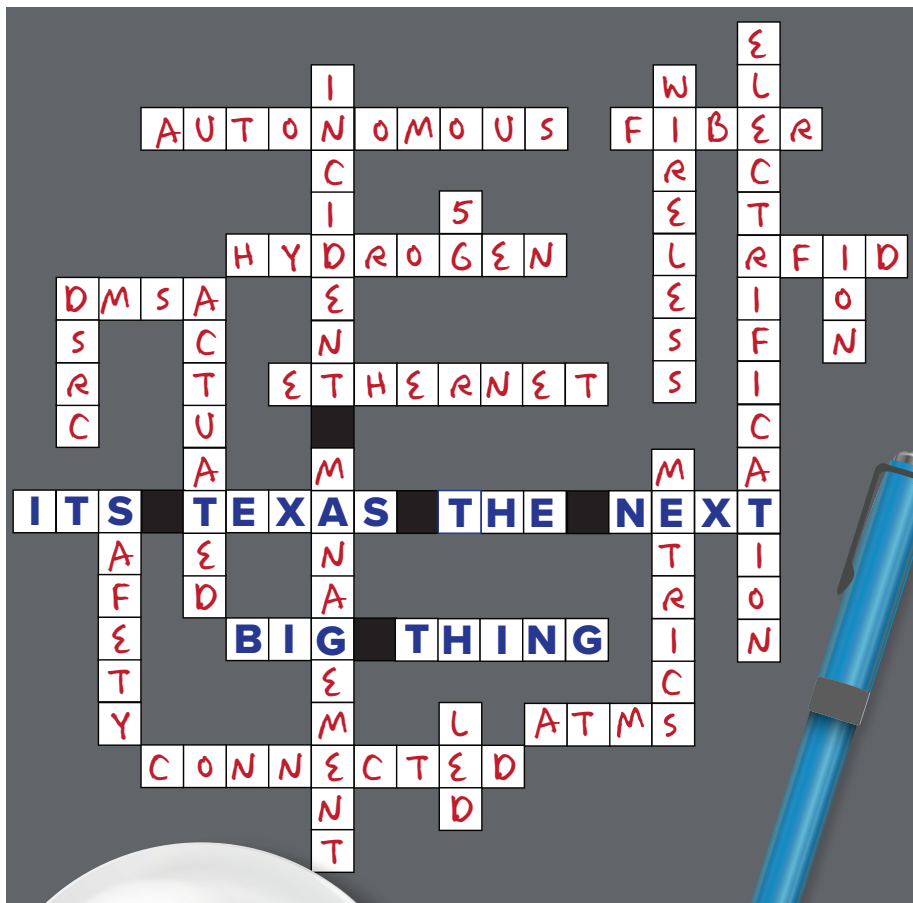

Diamond Interchange Operation

This workshop is intended for traffic operations professionals as well as traffic system designers. The discussion of operational and design considerations will look at standard diamond interchanges using traditional 4-phase and 3-phase operation. The discussion will also look at alternative designs such as diverging diamond interchange (DDI) and displaced left turn operation. It will include a general discussion of the controller unit in free and coordinated operation which will include Ring and Barrier configuration, detector location and channel assignments, load switch assignments, use of overlaps, actuated timing parameters and coordination programming.
